MINUTES

1. Welcome and opening of the meeting

Time allotted | 21/05/2019 14:00 | **Agenda topic** | Welcome and brief introductions | **Presenter** Prof. Artūras Kaklauskas, VGTU

Discussion: Prof. Artūras Kaklauskas opened the meeting and presented the agenda.

2. WP1. BECK capacity building framework: main findings and results

Time allotted | 27/02/2019 14:10 | Agenda topic | BECK capacity building framework |
Presenters Prof. Dilanthi Amaratunga, UoH and Dr. Laura Tupėnaitė, VGTU

Discussion:

Prof. Dilanthi Amaratunga reviewed progress on preparation of BECK capacity building framework. All partners completed their reports, currently information is summarized and analysed by UoR. Results will be presented and discussed at the 2nd project meeting in Huddersfield, the UK.

Dr. Laura Tupenaite reminded methodology of the project and commented on progress of implementation of the WP1 tasks, additional comments were provided by Prof. Dilanthi Amaratunga.

Conclusion:

- T.1.1. Workshop and focus groups to analyze needs, gaps and possibilities for common curricula development are completed.
- T.1.2. Preparation of reports by each university based on the Capacity Needs Assessment Methodology (United Nations 2013) completed.
- T.1.3. Development of BECK capacity building framework is in progress.
- T.1.4. Development of guidelines and accreditation rules for the quality assurance of MOOCs in progress.

Outcomes of WP1 will serve as a basis for development of common MOOCs.

2. BECK project implementation, information from EACEA

Discussion:

Luigi Saia, project officer in charge of monitoring BECK project, at the EU Commission in Brussels introduced himself. His role will be assisting through implementation of this project, during the three years, to help in administrative procedure also giving advices in the implementation of the content. Normally he will communicate with coordinator (VGTU) and only in very serious cases – with project partners. Partners shall liaise with the coordinator and coordinator – with the Agency. Luigi Saia provided the most important information on implementation of the project:





- 1. Capacity Building in the field of Higher Education is an action aiming at modernising the HEIs and education systems in the partner countries: Russia, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka (Partner countries PCs). Therefore all the activities must be targeting particularly the education system in PCs. The EU institutions (VGTU, UoH, TalTech, UNIBO) have to help in modernisation process. All dissemination activities will be targeting PCs.
- 2. BECK is the curriculum development project. The main objective of the project is to update curricula with MOOCs. MOOCs must be implemented by end of the project. The European Commission (EC) will check if a grant of EUR 1 mln. was managed in a good manner, smooth way, respecting the rules, as well as if activities from the application had been implemented. If not, the EC may apply some penalties. Partners are encouraged to have a good arrangement, listen to the coordinator, and propose to the coordinator a good plan to implement all activities in three years. All MOOCs must be accredited and implemented by end of the project.

Coordinator shall inform the Agency in case of implementation problems, Agency will try to find the solution. Preparation for accreditation must start now, to make sure that it will be on time and implementation of MOOCs will take at least 1/3 of the project life span. This is a requirement from the program guide.

- 3. If there are delays for 1-3 months in some project activities it's not a big issue, but if delays are accumulating and reaching 6 months or 1 year delay, that would be a problem, so partners have to be very careful and have a smooth planning in implementation of the activities.
- 4. Coordinator shall be respected, all supporting documents provided because there can be a request to do an audit during three years.
- 5. Partners have signed a grant agreement with all month dates so they are jointly responsible for the implementation of the project. If one or two partners fail the entire project can fail. Partners must have a very strong partnership in order to reach good results at the end of the project. It is extremely important.
- 6. It is important to respect procedure of the tendering, to apply correct logo of Erasmus+ in published documents. Equipment has to be purchased as soon as possible, not waiting till the end of the project.

Luigi Saia reminded that partners have to sign a partnership agreement within first 6 months. Agreement is very important because it defines how unit costs, travel costs, staff contracting, equipment are endorsed also it has clear procedures on how to deal with possible conflicts between partners, if it would happen. Prof. Artūras Kaklauskas replied that all agreements are already signed and funds transferred. All agreements will be sent to the Agency immediately. Luigi Saia encouraged participants to ask questions.

1. Prof. Emeritus Kariyawasam Don Nandasiori Weerasinghe raised concerns that accreditation of MOOCs can take longer than expected.

Luigi Saia noted that accreditation for starting MOOCs is necessary. Modules must be implemented at least for 1 year. Any possible delay in accreditation shall be known in advance. There is a possibility to extend project duration for 3-6 months/1 year. Bus it's not automatically accepted by the Agency, the reasons must be sound. Now it's too early to think about extension.

Prof. Artūras Kaklauskas commented that accreditation is quite simple. It must be achieved at faculty, university level and usually takes 1 month. Partners do not have to accredit new programme curricular, only to include new modules or update existing ones.

Luigi Saia asked if other partners have any problems about accreditation.

Elena Nikonchuk replied that accreditation is a part of WP4 (Quality assurance) and accreditation standards are being prepared, therefore there shall be no problems with accreditation.





2. Stefan Shvedov reported financial problems of ASV. Bank to which funds were transferred became out of licence, so no money available. Funds will be returned in 12 months. What solutions can be?

Luigi Saia commented that he can contact with ASV and Coordinator and to ask national Erasmus+ office in Russia for help.

He asked if other partners had any problems with fund transfers. Partners replied that no problems occurred.

Conclusion:

- 1. All project activities must be targeting particularly the education system in PCs (Russia, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh). The EU institutions (VGTU, UoH, TalTech, UNIBO) have to help PCs in modernisation process.
- 2. BECK is the curriculum development project. The main objective of the project is to update curricula with MOOCs. MOOCs must be accredited and implemented for one year of the project.
- 3. Partners have to be very careful and have a smooth planning in implementation of the activities; accumulation of delays must be avoided.
- 4. Coordinator shall be respected, all supporting documents provided.
- 5. Partners must have a very strong partnership in order to reach good results at the end of the project. Joint responsibilities are highlighted at the Agreement.
- 6. It is important to respect procedure of the tendering, to apply correct logo of Erasmus+ in published documents. Equipment has to be purchased as soon as possible.

3. WP1. Development of guidelines and accreditation rules for the quality assurance of MOOCs

Presenter Assoc. Prof Dr. Vaidotas Trinkūnas, VGTU

Discussion:

Assoc. Prof Dr. Vaidotas Trinkūnas, director at Educational Technology Center (VGTU), introduced Manual for Quality Assessment for E-learning (2016) by European Association of Distance Teaching Universities (EADTU) and OpenupEd quality benchmarks for MOOCs. He discussed key futures for MOOCs, including openness to learners, digital openness, learner-centred approach, independed learning, media-supported interaction, recognition options, quality focus, and spectrum of diversity. He also presented VGTU practices in implementation of the MOOCs, quality assurance procedures by OpenupEd methodology, accreditation process at VGTU and certification of MOOCs.

Conclusion:

Project may adapt OpenupEd methodology for quality assurance of MOOCs. Experience of VGTU can be used in support of accreditation and certification procedures at partner countries.

4. WP2. Development of New Adaptive MOOC Modules on Consumer's Behaviour Related to Energy Efficiency and Climate Change

Discussion:

- Prof. Dilanthi Amaratunga reminded objectives in implementation of WP2. She commented on tasks and provision of deliverables:
- T.2.1. Development of a common framework for BECK curricula. Directly linked to outcomes of WP1, will be in detail discussed at the UK.
- T.2.2. Development of a common approach to learner-centered and real problem-based teaching and lifelong learning activities. Task related to share of modules across institutions. There are different educational systems, indeed common grounds shall be found. Will be discussed at the UK.
- T.2.3. Training of teaching staff. Will be organized in Vilnius, staff will gain necessary competences for development of the MOOCs. VGTU expertise will be shared.
- T.2.4. Development of BECK MOOC modules specifications and teaching (learning) materials and adaptation to different learning contexts and different cycles of studies to different stakeholders will be based on previous outputs. Indicative contents are already included to proposal. Indicated education gaps (WP1) will be linked with learning opportunities (WP2, T.2.1, T.2.2).
- T.2.5. Assessment, recognition and certification of the developed BECK MOOC modules by universities in Russia, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka and integration to different cycles of corresponding studies. Partners shall bear in mind that certification is a time-taking procedure. Prof. Dilanthi Amaratunga proposed extended time scales for implementation of WP2.
